Cross-Regional Workshop to Promote the Ratification and Reporting on Implementation of the United Nations Convention against Corruption Toronto, Canada, 29 September -1 October 2009

The Caribbean and Central American Region as well as the Pacific region face a range of similar challenges in acceding to and implementing the United Nations Convention against Corruption. To address these challenges, the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and the International Centre for Criminal Law Reform and Criminal Justice Policy (ICCLR) conducted a cross-regional Workshop to Promote the Ratification and Reporting on Implementation of the United Nations Convention against Corruption in Toronto from 29 September to 1 October 2009.

The Workshop aimed at uniting practitioners from both regions to share good anti-corruption policies and practices with an emphasis on asset recovery, in order to assess the status of implementation of the Convention and to promote its ratification/accession. Furthermore, it aimed at identifying implementation gaps, technical assistance needs to fill such gaps and elements of action plans to advance accession to and implementation of UNCAC.
